Standard Operating Guideline Off-Road Vehicle Usage

Off-road Vehicle Usage

25.01 Purpose:

The purpose of this Guideline is to insure that there are guidelines regarding usage and safety in the event non-district owned off-road vehicles may be used during an incident.

25.02 Definitions

Off-road vehicles are defined as All Terrain Vehicles (ATV), Utility Vehicle (UTV), snowmobile or motorcycle.

- **25.03** Off-road vehicles should only be operated by the owner who is a member of the Department or if the vehicle is owned by another party there needs to be a Memorandum of Understanding between the owner (i.e. Sheriff Department) and the District.
- **25.04** The Off-road vehicle owner assumes all liability for damage to the vehicle or any property that may occur during its usage on the incident.
- **25.05** Operator should always wear appropriate Personal Protective Equipment when operating the vehicle. This may include long pants, over the ankle boots, gloves and helmet. If appropriate a DOT compliant helmet is recommended or structural fire helmet may be used. A wildland firefighting helmet does not offer adequate protection and should not be considered proper protective equipment for vehicle operation.
- **25.06** Operator should always follow applicable state and USFS laws and regulations when operating vehicle.
- **25.07** Never operate a vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- **25.08** Off-road vehicles should only carry passengers if designed to do so.
- **25.09** Operate only at a safe speed.
- **25.10** Operators should complete an ATV Safety Course.
